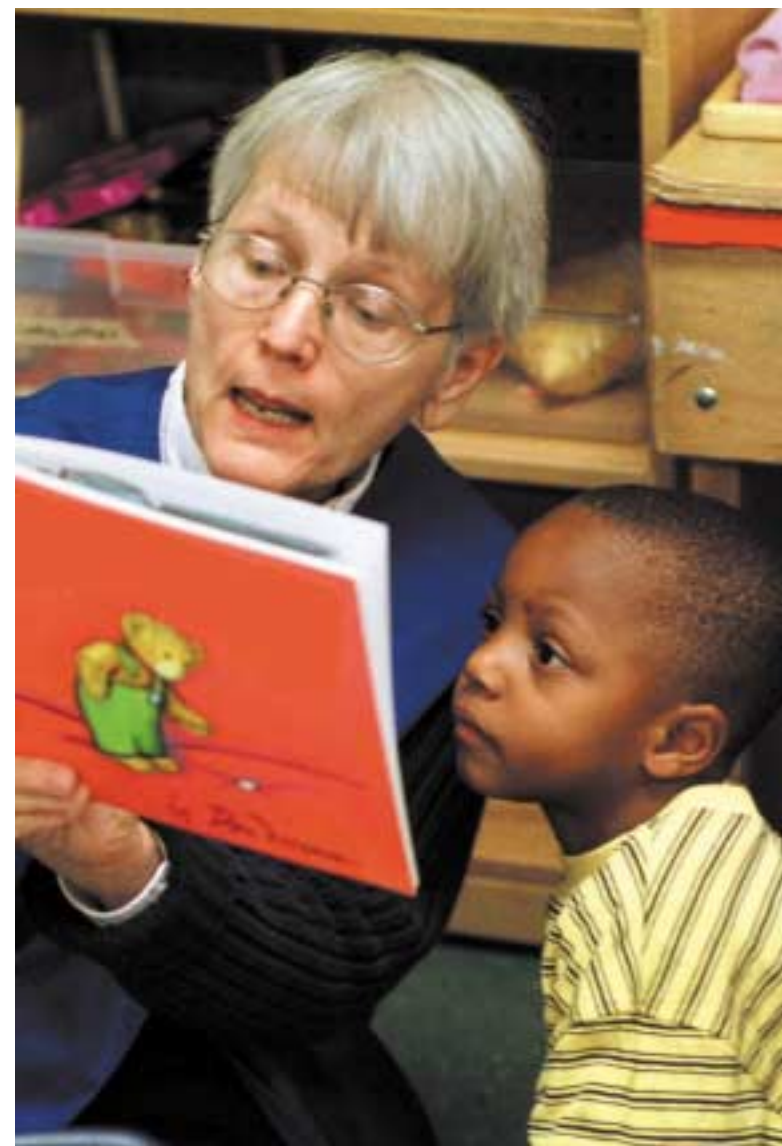
GENERATIONS UNITED (GU) is the national membership organization focused solely on improving the lives of children, youth, and older people through intergenerational strategies, programs, and public policies.

One way GU defines the intergenerational field is by identifying the intergenerational intersection in public policies that affect children, youth, and older adults.

- GU develops a legislative agenda for each Congress and educates members of Congress about the importance of supporting our youngest and oldest through effective public policies.
- The National Center on Grandparents and Other Relatives Raising Children provides training and technical assistance, awareness education, and advocacy on behalf grandfamilies, or children and their relative caregivers. The Center responds to thousands of requests for information each year and has directly trained more than 6500 professionals and caregivers.
- Project SHARE promotes the development of intergenerational shared sites programs by providing training and technical assistance to groups across the country interested in developing these innovative programs.

GU promotes the development of intergenerational programs by infusing intergenerational strategies into new venues and providing resources to interested groups across the country.

GU's i-PATH includes an on-line program directory to record and share emerging program models and serves as a clearinghouse for materials on intergenerational program development and research.
