

## 2012 GENERATIONS UNITED ANNUAL REPORT

Another great year has passed; a year in which the intergenerational community made significant strides in promoting policies and programs that benefit all ages and forge lasting bonds between among the generations.

We salute the work of our members, partners, and friends and look forward to continuing our journey in 2013. In the meantime, we'd like to offer a brief retrospective of some of Generations United's successes over the past year.

#### **JANUARY**

• Lauded by **UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon** for our work on shared sites. The UN also published excerpts of a paper by our executive director, Donna Butts.

#### **FEBRUARY**

- Issued a point-by-point response to the **President's budget** for Fiscal Year 2013, explaining how the new budget could affect the intergenerational community.
- Held a free seminar, **Evaluating Intergenerational Programs**, that provided evaluation tools and techniques that really work.

#### **MARCH**

- Recognized the recipients of the inaugural MetLife Foundation/ Generations United Best Intergenerational Communities awards at a briefing on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC. The recipients were:
  - o the Town of Lamoni, Iowa;
  - the City of Georgetown Texas;
  - o the City of Oberlin, Ohio;
  - o the County of San Diego, California.; and
  - Virginia Planning District 10.
- Collaborated with the American Bar Association in issuing the report, Improving Foster
   Care Licensing Standards, with a grant from the Annie E. Casey Foundation.



#### **APRIL**

- Responded to the 2012 **Social Security Trustees Report**.
- Challenged Sen. Paul Ryan's budget proposal, "Path to Prosperity," in an opinion piece by Donna Butts that was published in **The Hill** newspaper.
- Held a free webinar, Loyalty, Legacy & Choices: Constructive Conversations about Our Children's Parents, to help grandfamilies ease the burden for children whose parents are unable to care for them.

   Up for Kids: What Government and Communities Should Do to Support Kinship

## JUNE

- Announced plans to use **Grandparents Day** in September as an opportunity for all generations to engage in a week of intergenerational activism and activities.
- Responded to the **Supreme Court Ruling on Affordable Health Care Act** and created a fact sheet on the ACA's benefits for children and older adults.

## JULY

- Launched a new campaign, **Grand Faces**, **Grand Voices** to raise the visibility of adults age 50 and older who support policies and investments that help children and younger people thrive.
- Unveiled Grandparentsday.org, a website devoted specifically to provide resources, ideas and inspirations for making Grandparents Day a time of activism and intergenerational activities.

## **AUGUST**

- Created and distributed a new Action Guide for "Doing Something Grand" for Grandparents Day.
- Congratulated **Donna Butts** for being named by the NonProfit Times to its "**Power &** Influence Top 50."
- Announced six new "Programs of Distinction" for the intergenerational community:
  - o DOROT's Youth Volunteer Program, DOROT, New York, NY;
  - The JCA Heyman Interages Center, Jewish Council for the Aging of Greater Washington (JCA®), Rockville, MD;

"I know for a fact that Generations United was a large part of my selection as a Rhodes Scholar. During my interview, I was asked why intergenerational interactions were important. My experiences with GU events and people flooded my mind and helped me answer their question with conviction. I told them that intergenerational interactions were not just important - they were essential. In addition to serving as meaningful interactions that add purpose to both generations' lives, something I experienced firsthand, the support of intergenerational interactions is smart public policy: both communities have needs that can be met through and with one another. Resources are saved, communities are strengthened, and everyone wins in the process. We are used to talking about policy as a win-lose game. Intergenerational interactions show us that policy can be a win-win game, and GU is by far the most vocal champion of this hopeful reality."

- Collaborated with MetLife Mature Market Institute (MMMI) in issuing the MetLife Study on Grandparents and a tip sheet, "Grandparents Investing in Grandchildren: Actions Speak Louder than Words."
- Released **Grand Successes** that told the stories of some of the many successful individuals raised by their grandparents or other grandfamilies.




## **N**OVEMBER
