First National Technical Assistance Center on Grandfamilies and Kinship Families

Generations United is honored to create the first National Technical Assistance Center on Grandfamilies and Kinship Families, funded through a five-year cooperative agreement from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Community Living (ACL). We will coordinate the work of five partners and a diverse steering committee of the nation's leading experts on kinship and grandfamilies and caregivers from the GRAND Voices Network.





Virtual Global Conference

Generations United's **21st Intergenerational Conference** was held virtually this year and was our largest convening to date! With over 450 participants, representing 40 states and the District of Columbia, at least 8 tribes, and 18 countries, the three-day event was filled with inspiring and educational sessions. The highly acclaimed plenary session, **Sankofa: The Art of Intergenerational Storytelling**, is available to <u>watch</u> <u>online</u>. We are starting preparations for our next conference in 2023. - Making the Case for Intergenerational Programs provides rationale and facts to help you make the case for intergenerational programs.
- <u>Fact Sheet: Intergenerational Programs Benefit Everyone</u> serves as a companion piece to Making the Case and provides a synthesized overview of the benefits.
- Staying Connected While Staying Apart: Intergenerational Programs & the
 COVID-19 Pandemic shares an overview of intergenerational engagement during
 the pandemic.
- <u>Family Matters: Multigenerational Living is on the Rise and Here to Stay</u>
 includes the findings of a 2021 survey which revealed that multigenerational living
 nearly quadrupled in the past decade, with the pandemic playing a strong role.
- Sharing Our Space: A Toolkit for Developing and Enhancing Intergenerational Shared Sites is an online toolkit that details every step of the development and operation process, from initial planning to sustaining long-term shared site programs.
- Latino Grandfamilies: Helping Latino Children Thrive Through Connection to
 Culture and Family gives resources and tips to child welfare agencies, other
 government agencies, and nonprofit organizations so that they can better serve
 all Latino grandfamilies regardless of child welfare involvement. This toolkit joins
 our toolkits for African American Grandfamilies and American Indian and Alaska
 Native Grandfamilies released in 2020.
- Reinforcing a Strong Foundation: Equitable Supports for Basic Needs of Grandfamilies is our 2021 State of Grandfamilies in America Annual Report. It includes updated national and state data on grandfamilies and key recommendations to address inequities and provide critic I supports to serve grandfamilies well.

Supporting Grandfamilies

Our National Center on Grandfamilies continued to elevate the voices of grandfamilies through our **GRAND Voices Network**.


