

INTERGENERATIONAL HOUSING PROFILE: HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES & MAINTENANCE FOR THE ELDERLY (H.O.M.E.)

Project Summary

H.O.M.E. offers intergenerational housing in Chicago, Illinois because they believe that older adults should not be segregated from other generations.

H.O.M.E. and its residents also maintain that people of all ages benefit from connecting with one another in daily life.

H.O.M.E. owns and manages 78 apartments in three affordable intergenerational buildings where older adults choose between private apartments or, for those who desire more support and a family-like setting, Good Life Senior Residences.

The Good Life Model offers older adults, young people, and families an opportunity to live in a community, build robust relationships, and thrive in shared experiences.

Resident Assistants also live on-site and are typically younger people who welcome living and socializing with older people. They receive room and board and a stipend in exchange for cooking one or two weekly meals and spending time with residents.
